***Dubai,**





Lower-Rhine and died March 14, 1883 in London.


He is a philosopher, historian, sociologist, economist, journalist, theorist of the revolution, socialist and Prussian communist.





I am very stubborn!

I would choose the 19th century - 1800s.

It was a simpler time and, it seems to me, people especially family members talked to each other more and had better personal interaction - and this despite the lack of other phone communication tools available today.

Can you describe your integration experience since arriving in Canada?

When I arrived I was lucky (fortunately) to come across a family who immediately accepted me.

This family showed me a bit of the province and also explained to me **how things are done here.**

Also, I participated with my Canadian college comrades in other social activities and it is **thanks to them** that I have integrated so well in NB.
