We must rebuild this economy so that our region stands out among the rest. And it's by supporting our local entrepreneurs and encouraging other entrepreneurs to come and settle there that we will bring our economy back to life.

Q. How can the Chamber of Commerce play a leading role in attracting the newcomer and once here assisting them in their

journey and to successfully integrate them?

A. It is certain that the primary mandate of the CRCC is to give all the necessary support to our entrepreneurs and merchants to keep our economy going.
