Q. The question you detest? *Do you know how to speak African?*

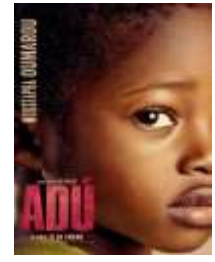
Q. The word that best describes you? **Humble**
